Rules According to The Orchard Church

- 1. Have a good attitude for the duration of the trip. No whining, complaining, etc. will be permitted on this trip. Students must participate in all activities unless physically unable.
- 2. Be respectful both of adults and fellow campers, this includes one's words and actions. This means no bullying, pranks, fighting, slanderous speech, being argumentative with adults, etc.
- 3. Respect all people's property and the places we visit. If damages are incurred, the responsible parties will be required to purchase a replacement or pay for the repair. Each individual is responsible for their own possessions. The church and Steven are not responsible if personal property is damaged, misplaced, or stolen during the trip.
- 4. No gum, food, or open drinks are allowed in the worship center at camp
- 5. Students and chaperones will be dressed modestly at all times in accordance with camp dress code. Do not wear short shorts/skirts (when arms are down at the sides fingertips must touch fabric), spaghetti straps or low cut shirts, shirts with open backs or large side openings that expose torso or undergarments, excessively tight fitting clothing, or clothing with inappropriate pictures/statements. Clothing advertising alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, explicit content, implied sexual innuendo, or hate speech toward others is also not allowed. Bathing suits must be one piece or if two-piece then worn with dark t-shirt worn over it. Also do not dress in a way that calls attention to underwear (sagging pants, rolling down waist bands, etc.) or wear pants/shorts with lettering across the backside. Chaperones reserve the right to define appropriate clothing with final decision resting with Steven. If clothing is deemed inappropriate, a student will be forced to change.
- 6. Cell phones and other electronic devices are discouraged while at camp. Cell phones are common for students, and parents like to keep in touch with their children. However, phones can be a huge distraction while at camp. Cell phones may be used while traveling, but camp rules stipulate students should not be on their phone except during free time. Adult chaperones have the authority to determine appropriate and inappropriate cell phone usage and may confiscate a student's phone if in violation. The phone will remain in the chaperone's possession until we have returned to Ellijay. Students may choose not to bring a phone and request to use an adult's phone to contact family.
- 7. No weapons, fireworks, alcohol, tobacco, vape, or illegal/unprescribed drugs are allowed.
- 8. A student should be with a portion or the whole group at all times. When we are at public locations (malls, hotels, restaurants), everyone is required to stay in groups of at least three, no exceptions. Students will also be required to be at meeting places on time!
- 9. Obey scheduled curfews and be mindful of noise levels late at night when others may be sleeping.
- 10. When traveling, if possible males and females will not be allowed to sit together. On overnight trips. only girls are allowed to enter into girls' rooms and only guys are allowed in the guys' rooms.
- 11. There will be no PDA (public display of affection). This means no kissing or any other type of suggestive physical interaction.
- 12. If a student's conduct is deemed unacceptable for failure to follow the rules, the student may be sent home at the discretion of Steven and the other adult chaperones. If determined a student needs to be sent home early, parents may be required to come pickup their child, or if chaperone brings them home early, then any incurred expenses will be paid or reimbursed by the parents of that student.

Packing List for Camp

What To Bring:

- 1-2 Towels, Pillows, sleeping bag or linens and blankets
- Refillable water bottle
- Closed-toe, closed-heel shoes for outdoor activities
- Shower shoes or flip flops
- Bible, notepad or journal, and a pen or pencil
- Toiletries such as toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, shampoo, soap, etc.
- Sun block
- Summer clothing for the six days (please note students should be dressed appropriately for evening worship), refer to dress code in the rules regarding appropriate clothing
- For Night Life, students will have the option to enjoy a "Night at the Movies" where they can dress to walk a red carpet before enjoying a fun flick with friends.
- Students may choose to bring western/cowboy attire for Mega Relay which is themed Yee-Haw
- Spending money for the two asterisked meals (roughly \$25-\$35) plus optional spending money at camp for snacks, camp merchandise, and missions offering

What **NOT** To Bring

- Any weapons, fireworks, alcohol, tobacco, vape paraphernalia, or illegal/unprescribed drugs
- Items that may be used for pranks such as water balloons, silly string, shaving cream, etc. as there is no pranks allowed at camp
- Inappropriate or immodest clothing as described in the dress code
- Electronic devices
- · Skateboards

NOTE: If students bring cell phones or other devices, they are not to be out except during free time.
